THE KELP FOREST WORD LIST - DEFINITIONS

- Abalone** - a marine snail; an endangered species
- Barracuda** - an edible, pike-like marine fish
- Carnivore** - an organism that eats only meat
- Current** - a body of water (or air) flowing in a definite direction
- Giant Kelp** - (*Macrocystis pyrifera*) a large, brown algae (seaweed)
- Halibut** - a large, edible, marine flatfish
- Herbivore** - an organism that eats only plants
- Hermit Crab** - a soft-bodied crab that lives in an empty snail shell
- Opaleye** - a small, marine fish; olive green with one or more yellowish spots on its back
- Pelican** - a large water bird with webbed feet and a pouch which hangs from its lower bill
- Scuba Diver** - a person who swims underwater with the aid of self-contained underwater breathing apparatus (SCUBA) gear
- Sea Lion** - a large, carnivorous, marine mammal
- Sea urchin** - a sea animal with a globular body covered with a spiny skin (an echinoderm)
- Sheephead** - a marine fish; males are black with a large red midsection; females are all red; The mascot of the Windows-On-Our-Waters Program
- Tides** - the alternate rise and fall of the surface of the seas, and various bodies of water connected with them
- Whale** - the largest of the marine mammals; the most commonly seen whales in southern California are gray whales, humpback whales, blue whales, and orcas.
